1. TIMETABLE

2. COMPETITOR SIGN-ON

YOU MUST SIGN-ON FOR THE EVENT PRIOR TO UNDERTAKING ANY TRACK ACTIVITY.

MOTORCYCLING AUSTRALIA INSURANCE COVER DOES NOT COMMENCE UNTIL YOU SIGN ON FOR THE EVENT.

Competitors' sign-on will be done in garage 20.

3. TECHNICAL INSPECTION

- 3.1 To ensure your machine and protective equipment is compliant please view the online technical inspection video available at https://www.stgeorgemcc.com/contact-us/road-race-bike-and-rider-set-up/
- 3.2 Technical inspection will be conducted in front of your garages on the concrete apron from 5.30 pm
- **3.3** After you have signed on, please have your motorcycle and protective equipment displayed on the concrete apron ready for inspection with transponder and GPS tracker fitted.
- 3.4 After 6.30pm competitors requiring any inspections should go to the green "Scrutineering" shed near the race control tower.

- 3.5 Machines must comply with the eligibility criteria and technical regulations for road racing as stated in the current Manual of Motorcycle Sport and the Supplementary Regulations for this event.
- **3.6** Transponders and GPS Trackers will be issued in garage 20 from 5.30 pm.
- 3.7 Please ensure your machine has the lower fairing removed to allow lock-wiring to be checked.
- 3.8 Radiators may be checked to confirm you are using water or a non-glycol-based coolant.
- **3.9** Any lock wire removed during a technical inspection must be replaced by the rider.
- **3.10** Race numbers must be legible at a distance of 20 metres and must be of contrasting colours to the motorcycle's paint scheme.
- **3.11** Front numbers must be positioned in the centre of the front fairing if possible or left of centre as seen when seated on the motorcycle.
- 3.12 Rear red light: Each competing motorcycle is to be fitted with an operational rear red light in accordance with the specifications in Rule 6.12.4.2 of the current MoMS. Lights will be inspected by the Technical Officers. Non- compliant lights will not be allowed. Competitors are strongly advised to hardwire the rear light to ensure continued function throughout the event.
 - 3.12.1 REAR RED LIGHTS MUST BE ACTIVATED ONCE THE CIRCUIT FLOODLIGHTS ARE ILLUMINATED.

4. PRACTICE STARTS

Practice starts are NOT permitted during this event.

5. FUEL

98 RON fuel is available at the circuit. Payment is via eftpos on the pumps. Refer to https://ardc.com.au/racefuels/

6. GARAGES

- **6.1** Garages are allocated by St. George MCC.
- 6.2 The garage allocation list will be posted on the St. George website and Facebook page.

7. COMPETITION (Note: this term encompasses practice, qualifying and racing)

7.1 Combined practice/qualifying:

- 7.1.1 Sessions will be of 10 minutes duration (i.e., 10 minutes from pit exit opening to chequered flag).
- **7.1.2** After receiving the chequered flag competitors are to leave the circuit **THROUGH THE TURN 4 GATE** To remind you of this:
 - A yellow flag will be waved at turn 3.4 on riders' right.
 - A red flag will be waved at turn 3.7 on riders' left.
 - An illuminated arrow on riders' right opposite turn 4 will be displayed.
- 7.1.3 Competitors must return to the garages at walking pace.

7.2 Racing:

- **7.2.1** All races are time certain.
- **7.2.2** A race may be declared or abandoned at the discretion of the Clerk of Course.
- 7.2.3 Race lengths are subject to change at any time. Announcements will be made if this is required.
- **7.2.4** There will be one (1) combined sighting/warm-up lap per race, i.e., your sighting lap will also be your warm-up lap.
- **7.2.5** It is your responsibility to know your grid position for each race. If you do not know your grid position a grid marshal will direct you to one. If this occurs, you must follow the grid official's instructions without delay. The Clerk of Course may impose penalties on riders who start from an incorrect grid position.
- **7.2.6** A race start occurs when the Starter extinguishes the red lights on the starting gantry. The red lights are switched on, then switched off. Machines must remain stationary, in the correct grid position, until the red lights go out.
- **7.2.7** To allow all competing riders to receive a race classification, upon receiving the chequered flag the lead rider should not overtake any other rider.
- 7.2.8 After receiving the chequered flag competitors should leave the circuit THROUGH THE TURN 4 GATE To remind you of this:
 - A yellow flag will be waved at turn 3.4 on riders' right.
 - A red flag will be waved at turn 3.7 on riders' left.
 - An illuminated arrow on riders' right opposite turn 4 will be displayed.

7.3 NOTE: THIS IS NOT A RIDE DAY - THE CHEQUERED FLAG IS DISPLAYED AT THE START/FINISH LINE

- 7.4 If an incident occurs and the full-course red flags and / or lights are displayed:
 - Reduce speed, proceed with caution, and leave the circuit AT PIT ENTRY
 - Return to your garages and await further instructions via pit announcements.
 - Be aware that emergency vehicles may be on the circuit.
 - Remain vigilant, exercise caution and do not overtake any moving emergency vehicles or machines.
 - Exercise extreme caution when approaching and passing any incident scene.

7.5 Entering the circuit

- **7.5.1** Sirens will be sounded prior to the commencement of each practice/qualifying session or race the first at 2 minutes prior, and the second at 30 seconds prior. Upon hearing these sirens competitors should make their way to pit exit
- 7.5.2 Pit exit will be opened by the display of a green flag and/or light for 20 seconds to allow competitors to enter the circuit.
- **7.5.3** Pit exit will be closed by the display of a red flag and/or light.
- **7.5.4** Competitors arriving at pit exit after it has been closed will start their race from pit lane.

RIDERS MUST STOP AND FOLLOW THE INSTRUCTIONS OF THE PIT EXIT OFFICIAL.

7.5.5 If a rider has not commenced the race after the leader has completed one lap, the rider is considered to have retired and will not be allowed to enter the circuit

8. PIT LANE

- 8.1 Please see MoMS Rule 17.1 APPENDIX A: PROTECTIVE CLOTHING AND EQUIPMENT "Fully enclosed footwear is to be worn in all pit areas, including pit lane and garages"
- 8.2 Traffic is one-way in race direction
- 8.3 Ride at walking pace only
- 8.4 No smoking in pit lane or garages. Smoking is only permitted in those areas designated by ARDC
- 8.5 No spectators are allowed on pit wall
- **8.6** Pit wall rider signalling using **approved** pit boards is permitted from the pit wall opposite your garage. Team personnel who intend to display pit boards to riders must sign on with the Race Secretary
- 8.7 No pushbikes, wheelchairs, prams, furniture, or persons under 16 (unless a competitor) are permitted past the red line at the front garage front door.

9. TROPHIES

Presentation of trophies will be at the rear of garage 20, commencing 15 minutes after the end of racing.

10. TRANSPONDERS FOR ELECTRONIC TIMING

- **10.1** Transponders must be returned to garage 20 at the end of the event.
- **10.2** By entering this event, you agree to these terms of transponder usage.
- 10.3 Transponders damaged during the event, or not returned at the conclusion of the event, will incur a fee of \$655.
- 10.4 Transponders must be secured to your motorcycle using an AMB transponder bracket <u>ONLY</u>. These brackets are available for purchase at a cost of \$15 each.
- 10.5 Technical Officers will check the placement of brackets and the secure attachment of the transponder to your motorcycle.
